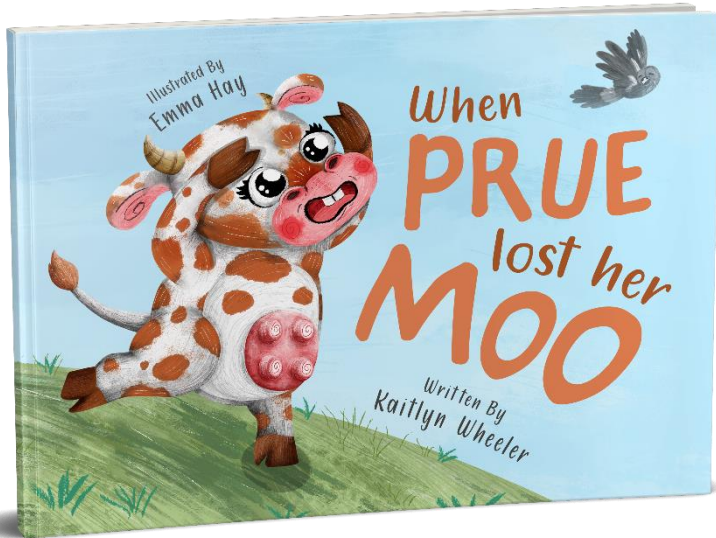

She finds inspiration for her books on her family farm and funny life experiences!

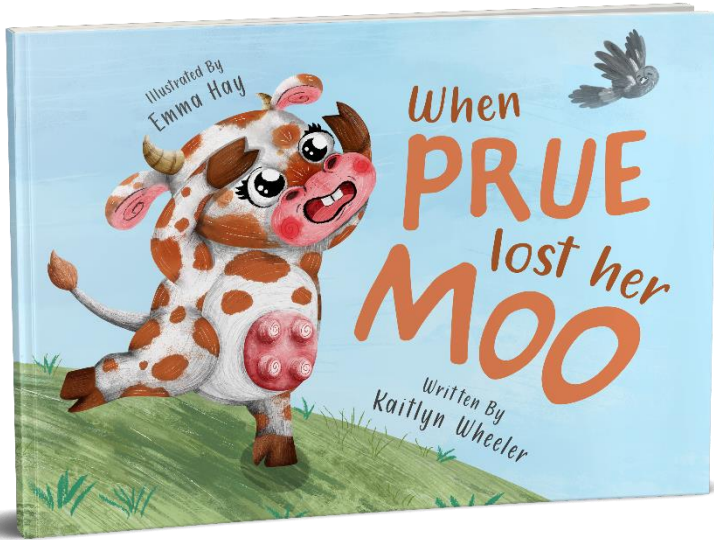

## A CONVERSATION WITH THE AUTHOR

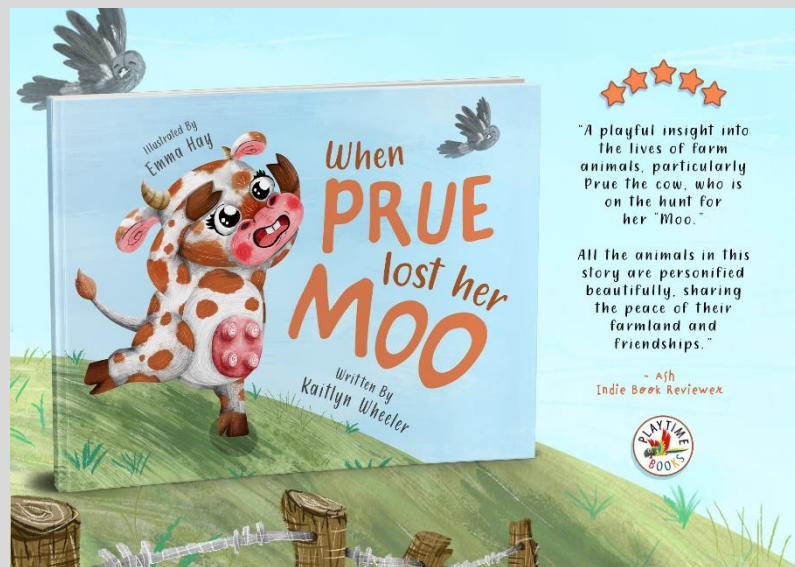
### WHAT WAS AN EARLY EXPERIENCE WHERE YOU LEARNED THAT LANGUAGE HAD POWER?

I have always loved reading and picture books, even as an adult! I truly understood the power of language when I was at school, in year 11 and 12. My teacher was passionate about literature, teaching us how to look at a book beyond the ink and to search for the story's true meaning. I came to understand the importance of the reader-writer relationship during this time, and it has become a big part of my own writing.

### HOW DO YOU SELECT NAMES OF YOUR CHARACTERS?

Some of the characters' names come from the names of pets and animals from our farm whilst others are used to support the rhyming and energetic nature of the story.

*When Prue Lost Her Moo* features the characters Peppy and Jedda. These characters' names come from two of our family horses that my sisters and I learnt to ride on. Prue was the name of one of our cows that had become a family favourite on the farm. She loved eating bread and was so quiet that you could hand feed her.
